US State Dept Travel Advisory

The US Department of State currently recommends US citizens RECONSIDER TRAVEL to Egypt due to COVID-19. Exercise increased caution in Egypt due to terrorism and the Embassy's limited ability to assist dual national US-Egyptian citizens who are arrested or detained.

Passport/Visa Requirements US citizens should make sure their passport will not expire for at least 6 months after they enter the country even if they do not intend to stay that long. They should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any entry stamp and or visa that will be required. A visa is required. US citizens will need to get in touch with the country's embassy or nearest consulate to obtain a visa

prior to visiting the country.


