## Mexico US State Dept Travel Advisory

The US Department of State currently recommends US citizens RECONSIDER TRAVEL to Mexico due to COVID-19. Exercise increased caution in Mexico due to crime and kidnapping. Consult its website daily via the link below for any travel advisories about visiting this country.

US citizens should make sure their passport is valid at the date of their entering the country. They should also make sure they have at least 1 blank page in their passport for any entry stamp that will be required. A visa is not required if stay is less than 180 days.
